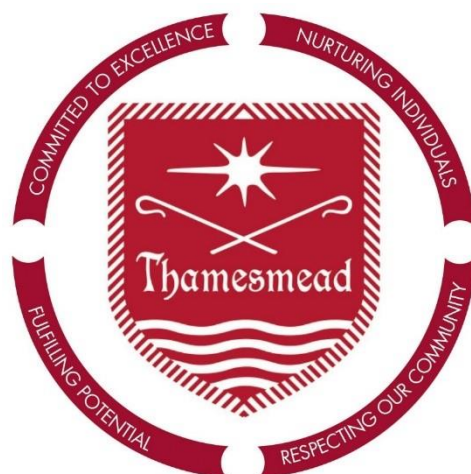

THAMESMEAD SCHOOL

Thamesmead School recognises the value of having a uniform for the following reasons:

- **Safety** – If all students wear a clearly recognisable uniform it can immediately be recognised at a distance as a member of our school. In a situation where someone who isn't a member of the school is on-site, they can be easily identified as not part of the school by their lack of uniform. This can be extended to days outside of school grounds. On day trips away, children can easily be spotted among crowds.
- **Preparations for the future** – Dressing professionally in working environments is expected in adulthood. Uniform helps young people get used to dressing to a prescribed professional standard. It also helps them know the difference between formal and informal dress.
- **Value for money** – Good quality uniform is an economic way of dressing young people for school. You know exactly what to buy and when to buy it, and often uniform can be used for more than one school year as there are no fashion pressures. The uniform is robust and designed for longevity. They'll last much longer than your child's other clothing, helping you save money by not having to replace them as often.
- **Relieves students from fashion 'stress'** – School uniform eliminates the stress placed on students to purchase and wear expensive, fashionable and designer items. Wearing a uniform can reduce decision making, peer pressure and stress of selection for teenagers, so they and their family can focus on a calmer start in the mornings.
- **Focus on development of character over visual identity** – What children wear can define the child rather than the content of their character. Children should be prioritising the development of their personality, having the confidence to be who they are and not be defined by material things like the clothes they wear. With the Thamesmead school uniform, your child can express themselves in more meaningful ways, which helps to develop their creativity.
- **A sense of pride** – We all feel proud of our children when they are well dressed in the uniform. Uniform and team kits also help students to demonstrate pride in Thamesmead School. Wearing uniform creates equality such as across gender and socioeconomic backgrounds. At Thamesmead our children come together from different backgrounds and can immediately identify a fellow member of their team from the clothes that they wear, breeding a sense of cohesion and commonality.
- **Helps raise aspirations** – The smarter you feel the more you believe you can achieve. Wearing a uniform signals that you are ready to work and have an affinity with learning. Once children dress in uniform, their purpose is to work hard in their lessons. A sense of professionalism develops within each child, leading to more focus in the classroom.

UNIFORM

The Uniform Policy operates **in school** and when students are **travelling to and from school**

Shirts	Plain white, with a top collar button, which must be done up. The shirt must be worn tucked in at all times.
Polo Shirts	Optional school polo shirt with house colour trim on the collar, purchased from the approved supplier*, may be worn as an alternative to the plain white shirt for the Summer term only (after the Easter holiday until the end of the summer term). No other polo shirts/shirts/t-shirts may be worn
Blazers	School blazer, with school badge, purchased from the approved supplier.* Only school issued badges may be worn on the blazer. Blazers should be free of any other badges.
Jumpers	Optional black V-neck jumper with school badge, purchased from approved supplier*, may be worn as an additional item in cold weather. It is not an alternative to the blazer. No other jumpers/cardigans/hoodies may be worn. If a child wears an alternative jumper/cardigan/hoodie to school this will be confiscated.
Tie	The appropriate clip-on House tie must be worn for school, available for purchase from the approved supplier* and the school office.
Trousers	Black tailored school trousers with no decorative belts/buttons/zips. Belts should be plain black with plain, non-branded buckles or belt straps. For further clarification, the following are not allowed: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Jeans or trousers with 'jean-style' features e.g. drill cotton, studs, outer seams.• Skinny fit or tight-fitting trousers.• Leggings or jeggings
Skirts	Only the Thamesmead school skirt, purchased from the approved supplier*, is permitted to be worn. The skirts must not be rolled up at the waistband at any time and should be worn on the knee or below. If a child wears a skirt that is well above the knee they will be asked to change into a longer skirt (if available) or trousers from the office. <i>Please note that from September 2021 at the time of purchase the waist band must sit on the waist and the hem of the skirt must be below the knee to allow for growth. Skirts worn above the knee cap will not be permitted.</i>
Socks	Plain white, grey or black socks. Knee high or ankle length. Red PE socks should only be worn for PE.
Tights	Black or flesh coloured tights only, no leggings.
Footwear	Plain, black, low-heeled shoes only – these may be slip on, buckled, lace ups or Velcro fasten. Boots of any description, canvas shoes and trainers/trainer style shoes (including skate shoes and similar styles that resemble trainers) are not to be worn. If a child does not wear school approved footwear to school they will be asked to change into a pair of school shoes from the office.
Outdoor Clothing	Coats must be plain in colour. Leather or denim jackets are not permitted. Scarves, hats and gloves are not to be worn in class or inside the school building. Coats are permitted in corridors but must be removed in classrooms and in the canteen.
Hair	Natural hair colours only. Hair braided with beads or cotton is not permitted. Long hair should be tied back/styled off the face in lessons. Any hair accessories worn, e.g. headbands, should be discrete and these should be plain black, grey or red. Headscarves, if worn, must be plain black, grey or red. Shapes, lines or symbols shaved into the head,

extreme haircuts, or a haircut less than a grade 2 are not acceptable.

Make-Up	Light foundation only, no other make-up allowed. Semi-permanent make up of any kind is not permitted, this includes but is not limited to: nail polish and false/acrylic/gel nails or tips, false eyelashes and eyelash extensions, tinted eyebrows. Nails should be kept cut short.
Jewellery**	A watch and one plain stud (<5 mm in diameter) per ear lobe are allowed. No other body piercing is permitted, including ear stretchers. For safety reasons no other jewellery is permitted, including rings, necklaces, charity bands and bracelets. Failure to conform will mean confiscation of jewellery until the end of the week. Jewellery must be removed for PE and practical lessons.
Valuables**	Mobile phones must be turned off throughout the whole day and kept out of sight at all times. Wearable communication devices/Smart Watches, headphones, earphones, earbuds or similar must not be worn. If a student is found using or wearing any of these items in school they will be confiscated and retained for collection from the main office in accordance with the Behaviour Policy

**The school does not accept responsibility for items of this kind. Confiscated items are stored securely.

PE Equipment for core PE lessons	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Red and black T-shirt with school crest, purchased from the approved supplier*• Red and black Thamesmead sports quarter zip sweatshirt purchased from the approved supplier* If a child wears an alternative sweatshirt or hoodie to school this will be confiscated, and they will be given a school sweatshirt to wear.• Plain black shorts, skorts (mid thigh or longer) and /or plain black tracksuit bottoms.• Plain black leggings may be worn. See-through leggings, leggings with sheer panels or holes are not permitted.• Clothing for PE with large logos, emblems, stripes, patterns, sequins, diamante or similar is not permitted.• Trainers that correctly support the foot – NOT fashionable plimsolls/canvas footwear• Red socks for all sports <p>Optional:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Football boots• Shin pads are highly recommended for football and hockey• A mouth guard is highly recommended for hockey and rugby

- Please ensure there is no overt branding on any item of clothing.
- Whilst we cannot cover every eventuality in this brief description, we would trust that both parents and students will uphold the spirit of our uniform policy.
- The Governing Body consults with parents and students regarding changes to this uniform policy and it may be that alterations to the uniform are brought about following consultation.

Expectations for dress when students are out of uniform

In some situations, students may be allowed to wear clothing that is not uniform to school or during school activities. Such situations include non-uniform (mufti) days and school visits.

Please note that the normal hair, make-up, jewellery and mobile phone rules apply on mufti days and on school visits.

On these occasions specific instructions will be given as to what is appropriate clothing. Clothing will need to be suitable for the specific activity.

Chosen clothing should;

- remain decent and not be revealing
 - crop tops or hot pants are not permitted
- not have the potential to offend to others
- not present a health and safety risk to the student or other students
 - sliders, flip flops, open toe shoes are not permitted

If a student's clothing on these occasions is not considered appropriate for the occasion/ activity or it has not conformed with specific guidance issued then school will ask students to change into clothing provided by the school or contact parents to bring appropriate clothing in. This may include school uniform or PE kit. The student will not be permitted to participate in the activity if they do not cooperate. In cases of non-cooperation the student will be placed in internal exclusion until this can be corrected.
