



<u>Surrey Youth Commission on Police and Crime: Application</u> Guidance Notes

Application Deadline: 27th October 2023

Please read carefully before filling in your application form.

1. What is the Youth Commission on Police and Crime?

The Youth Commission enables young people to inform and support, the work of the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Surrey. The project allows young people to get involved and have their say on policing and crime where they live.

2. Who can join the Surrey Youth Commission?

We are looking for participants aged 14-25 years who live in Surrey.

In total, we are seeking to recruit 25 to 30 young people. We are looking for people who will be good team players, who will be committed to the project and be willing to do all the activities involved.

We are also very keen to ensure that the Youth Commission is made up of a diverse group of young people who broadly reflect the make-up of the local population, including those who may have direct experience of the criminal justice system, from faith groups and those who may have been a victim of crime.

3. If I join, what will I have to do?

Throughout 2023-24, members of the Youth Commission will:

- Take part in Youth Commission sessions: You will participate in Youth Commission sessions. The first two sessions will take place on a Saturday. Other smaller meetings will generally be on weekdays (early evenings).
- Work on special topics: As a group, you will select priority topics to work on during your time on the Youth Commission. The shortlist will be determined by the Youth Commission and may include topics such as relations with the police, reducing youth offending, substance abuse etc.
- Plan events: You will work in a team to design and plan interactive workshops to engage
 other young people and partner agencies in your area. You will be invited to help to run
 these events whenever possible, as long as there is no clash with your school/college
 commitments.
- Gather the views of other young people: You will be given support to carry out peer
 research with other young people in schools, colleges, universities, and youth groups. This
 can be done to suit your schedule and can fit around your existing commitments.





- Report back to the office of the Police and Crime Commissioner: You will contribute towards the analysis of information gathered from young people in your area and help to present back your conclusions to the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner.
- **Help to host the Youth Commission Conference:** You will have the opportunity to present your results and recommendations and be a part of discussions with key decision makers within the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner, Surrey Police, partner agencies and other young people.

4. What will I get from being part of the Youth Commission?

You will have the opportunity to:

- Discuss issues with the Police and Crime Commissioner, police, and key partners: You will
 meet the Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner, representatives of Surrey Police and
 other partners at Youth Commission events and help them to understand what young
 people in your area think about police and crime.
- **Develop your skills and experience:** You will gain valuable skills and experience, which you will be able to use for your CV or applications to Further or Higher Education.
- **Become ambassadors for other young people:** You will give a voice to young people in your area by helping them to get their views heard.
- **Meet new people:** You will meet a diverse range of other young people from across Surrey, and work alongside professionals from different organisations.

5. Filling in the application form

- **Section 1:** if you are under 18 you must also fill out the section regarding your Parent /Guardian /Carer. They will also have to complete and sign the Consent Form to give their permission for you to participate.
- **Privacy:** Your privacy is really important to us. By filling in the Surrey Youth Commission application form, you are consenting to Leaders Unlocked using your personal information to keep in touch with you over the course of the project.
