Thinking of Training To Teach?

Did you know there are bursaries and scholarships available to help finance your teacher training?

You could receive up to £29,000 tax-free while you train in the form of a government teacher training bursary. Bursaries are tax-free payments you receive if you are training to teach in certain subjects.
