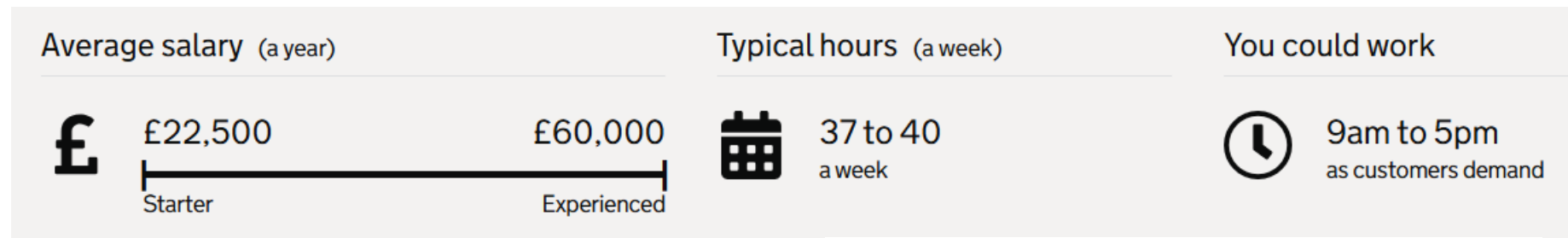


Agronomist
