

## Year 9 Curriculum Newsletter Summer Term 1

### English



**What are we doing this half term?** Drama Study - Julius Caesar. Students continue their Shakespearean journey with this key Roman play. They will learn key extracts, character and plot as well as the context that it was written in.

**Assessment:** End of unit assessment - Tri-weekly assessment.

**How can parents help?** Please ensure your child completes their Lexia minutes and completes all home learning. If you can listen to your child read, that is even better!

### Religion, Philosophy and Ethics (RPE)



**What are we doing this half term?** Will will study the AQA GCSE Unit Jewish Beliefs this half term.

**Assessment:** The same style of assessment is used throughout the year. 5 questions that add up to 24

**How can parents help?** Ask your son/daughter lots of questions, play devils advocate!

### PE



**What are we doing this half term?** With a focus on athletics and striking and fielding activities, such as cricket, rounders and softball students will continue to improve and develop not just their athletic ability but also learn valuable skills to take away such as teamwork, communication, leadership and sportsmanship. With each sport they will continue to develop more advanced skills, tactics and strategies.

**Assessments :** Students will be assessed throughout the practical blocks of work.

**How can parents help?** Please ensure students complete home learning tasks on time and that they are organised with their full kit on PE days.

### Science



**What are we doing this half term?** Cell Biology, Atomic structure and the Periodic Table and Energy topics are completed.

**Assessments:** 2 assessments carried out in class over the half term.

How can parents help? Ensure your child has the correct equipment such as a pencil, ruler and their own scientific calculator. The BBC GCSE bitesize is a useful resource for homework tasks and revision - <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/subjects/zrkw2hv>.

Students to complete weekly Sparx science tasks.

### Maths



**What are we doing this half term?** Year 9 students will be working on Quadratic Graphs, Angles in Triangles, Quadrilaterals and Polygons, Angles on Parallel Lines and Bearings, Transformations (Translation, Reflection, Rotation & Enlargement).

**Assessment:** Students will be doing an open book tri-weekly assessment once each unit of work has been completed.

**How can parents help?** Please help students to check they have the correct Maths equipment, especially scientific calculators, and that homework is being completed. Sparx home learning is personalised and they are expected to achieve 100% score.

### Art



**What are we doing this half term?** Students are continuing to explore the Mexican culture and the Day of the Dead festival within their 'Life & Death in Mexican Art' project. Students are inspired by a variety of traditional and current popular culture references alongside artists such as Frida Kahlo and Butch Loosin. Students refine their skills using a variety of painting and drawing techniques and processes to create their own Calavera celebrating the life of a loved one or someone they admire.

**How can parents help?** Please ensure that your child completes all their Art & Design homework activities for this project. High quality drawing and painting equipment will support students in completing their work in lesson and at home. Discussing popular culture and examples of Art & Design in our everyday lives encourages students to make connections and develops visual literacy to support creative thinking.

## History



**What are we doing this half term?** We continue our studies of World War Two, moving on to an in depth study of the Holocaust - looking at both victims and perpetrators and how and why this happened. We then move on to

looking at the fight for Civil Rights from around the world from both here in the UK, to the USA, South Africa, India and elsewhere.

**Assessment:** End of year assessment.

**How can parents help?** Encourage your child to read books or watch films related to World War Two and the Holocaust such as the 'Once' series by Morris Gleitzmann or the film 'The Pianist.' Visit the Imperial War Museum.

## Geography



**What are we doing this half term?** Y9 students will explore sustainable cities.

**Assessments:** Checkpoint assessment and end of topic written assessment.

**How can parents help?** Ensure your child has a glue and scissors. Make sure the glossary sheet is fully completed. Revision notes for assessments need to follow the guidance on the revision help sheet.

## French



**What are we doing this half term?** Target Language Speaking world. Students will develop an understanding of the key information and cultural differences between the different regions of France, such as festivals, food & drink and key environmental aspects

**Assessment:** vocabulary test and End of year assessment.

**How can parents help?** Encourage your child to learn the new words and phrases regularly by testing themselves or by testing them.

## Drama



**What are we doing this half term?**

Students have previously learnt how to make drama using a range of techniques and skills and will now learn more about other people who have made drama in their own styles. This half term students will learn about a range of Theatre Practitioners; those from the past and those who are making theatre today.

**Assessment:** Making a piece of drama in the style of a practitioner and key drama words learnt during the half term.

**How can parents help?** Please ensure your child completes their homework on time and encourage them to research into past and current theatre makers.

## Music



**What are we doing this half term?** Year 9 students are learning about film music. They will be continuing to develop key knowledge and vocabulary based around the elements of music and being able to analyse music using relevant terminology. This is to set them up well for the start of GCSE if choosing it as an option. They will also be performing and composing film music on their chosen instrument.

**How can parents help?** Encourage them to listen to lots of film music at home.

## Spanish



**What are we doing this half term?** Target Language Speaking world. Students will explore festivals and cultures related to religion, beliefs, and heritage in Spanish-speaking countries.

**Assessment:** vocab test and End of year assessment.

**How can parents help?** Encourage your child to learn the new words and phrases regularly by testing themselves or by testing them.

## Computer Science



**What are we doing this half term?** Fundamentals of Networks

**Assessment:** On the topic above students will answer a mixture of multiple-choice, short-answer and extended-response questions.

## Food and Nutrition



**What are we doing this half term?** This year more complex practical skills are introduced in preparation for KS4 study. This ensures that students who opt for the subject at KS4 are well prepared but also those that do not continue with the subject still learn complex skills that they can use at home. A key focus is different pastry skills and considering the different nutritional profiles of different types of pastry. These intermediate skills build on the foundations of the basic skills learned in year 7 and 8. Our students come from a variety of different cultures so a focus in year 9 is International and British cuisines. This topic is sequenced in the final year of KS3 as it pulls through knowledge from the previous years and also from other subjects such as RE, Science, Geography and Maths.

Practical lessons include: Fruity Crumble bars, Homemade Fresh pasta, Cauliflower Mac and Cheese, Swiss Roll and improving a recipe and remaking a dish.

**How can parents help?** Students will be given regular verbal feedback within their practical lessons 'in the moment'. This allows students to act upon this feedback immediately for the maximum impact on progress. Students will be assessed via written and practical assessments.

## Design Technology (Rotation)



**What are we doing this half term?:** Students will learn about metal materials. They will cut, drill, file and finish galvanised steel sheet into a desk tidy. They will learn about heat treatment and bending metals effectively. They will also learn about casting metals and make a piece of pewter jewellery/key ring. They will also learn about mechanisms. The project aims to introduce students to practical skills relating to metal. The students will use a range of tools and equipment in order to create products made from metals.

**Assessments:** The complexity and quality of the material.

**How can parents help?:** Take an interest in the project work and skills they are learning and discuss them. Help them look at products made from metal materials and try and work out how they are made and constructed.

## DT Textiles –(Rotation)

**What are we doing this half term?:** Students will be advancing their decorative skills and design creativity by making a textile wall hanging based on an inspirational theme. It will include printing, embroidery and applique techniques. Students will be introduced to the method of working needed for the new Textile Design GCSE.

**Assessments:** The research task into the inspiration for the design will be assessed, as well as each decorative technique and the final construction.

**How can parents help?** Discuss the project, look at existing textile designs that exist in your home and other places. Help them to experiment or practice sewing skills at home.

## DT Graphics (rotation)



**What are we doing this half term?:** Students will be learning about what graphics is and how it is applied to different products. Students will then spend time researching colour theory and typography and looking at how graphic products are produced, before embarking on a series of Design Challenges that involve them designing graphic products. The project aims to encourage students to consider how information is communicated, and what makes an effective graphic product, before giving them the chance to create some.

**Assessments:** Students will be assessed in the areas of Investigation (analysing film posters), Designing (designing a graphic product), Making (producing a graphic product) and Evaluating (evaluating the effectiveness of the final product).
